RESEARCH AND EXPERTISE:

My research interests and area of expertise cover:

- Labour migration policies and development in North Africa;
- Regulation of labour migration vs. deregulation of labour;
- EU-MENA relations;
- Quantitative and qualitative methods.

Currently, my research interests focus on **the governance of labour migration, modes of norm diffusion and policy transfer** in bilateral and multilateral talks on the "management" of **international migration**. I am most interested in comparatively analysing policy design and implementation as well as how policy transfers are administered (and readjusted) through processes of bilateral and multilateral consultations involving countries located in the Euro-**Mediterranean area**.

My publications have appeared in a range of peer-reviewed journals. I also created two **datasets** on migration policy matters that are commonly used by the research community. I have a proven track record in **raising external funds** for research (from the EU, national funding agencies and private donors). I **supervised** and managed interdisciplinary research projects mobilising EU and non-EU partner institutions (in Africa, the Middle East, the Mediterranean and the Caucasus).

In the course of my academic career, I have also worked for the Turin-based **International Training Centre of the International Labour Organisation (ITC-ILO)** and served as a consultant to the **European Parliament**. I also cooperated with **UNECA and the OECD** on development matters.
